You don't have to leave the house to travel to new places and meet new people. We are inviting our dragons to travel some place new by reading a book this summer. Below is a list of the summer reading books and assignments for each grade. The completed activities are due to your child's new teacher no later than **Friday**, **August 29**, **2025**. You can choose to buy your assigned book, use one of the free digital options listed in the table below, or visit http://read.dadeschools.net/.

Grade	Book	Assignment
Entering K	Pick your favorite book or e-book (OER Destiny Discover, audible, or any other digital source)	On a white sheet of paper students will write their first and last name, the title of the book they read, and draw their favorite part of the book in pencil. Students will then color their drawings.
Entering 1ST	Pick your favorite book or e-book (OER Destiny Discover, audible, or any other digital source)	On a sheet of paper or construction paper, students will write their first and last name, the title, and the author's name for the book they read. Then, they will explain what happened in the beginning, middle, and end of their story by drawing a picture and writing a sentence for each part (beginning, middle, and end). Students must also color each of their drawings. (TEMPLATE PROVIDED)
Entering 2ND	Fly Guy's Big Family Volcanoes! (National Geographic Readers)	Complete Summer Reading Log on-line: https://forms.office.com/r/Kb5UQBgW13 On a sheet of paper, students will write their first and last name, the book's title, and the author's name. Students will then write 2 sentences explaining what happened in the beginning, 2 sentences explaining the middle, and 2 sentences explaining the end of the story. Finally, the students will draw their favorite scene from the book in pencil and color it in. (TEMPLATE PROVIDED)
Entering 3RD	Horrible Harry in Room 2B or <u>Living</u> inMexico: Ready-to- Read Level 2	Complete Summer Reading Log on-line: https://forms.office.com/r/SRK2MBiUfV Students will write a one sentence summary for each chapter of their book. Students may handwrite the summaries on a sheet of paper or use any Office 365 products found in the student portal. All work must include the student's name, book's title, author, and headings for each chapter. All work MUST be completed by the student .

Students may handwrite the summaries on a sheet of paper or use any Office 365 products found in the student portal. All work <u>must include</u> the student's name, book's title, author, and headings for each chapter. All work MUST be completed by the student.
Entering 5 TH	The One and Only Ivan by Katherine Applegate YouTube Free Digital Option: 14 Read Aloud Series by Amy Coffey https://youtube.com/playlist?list=PLfAU5 1YqKda6t4t_NhhMQ4INB0epd2oBc	Create a Comic Strip on PowerPoint or on 8x11 paper with 8 to 10 scenes from the book showing the main events. Be sure to include dialogue bubbles and color illustrations for each of the scenes. Please include the book's title and author. All work MUST be completed by the student.
