3 Lessons Passed:

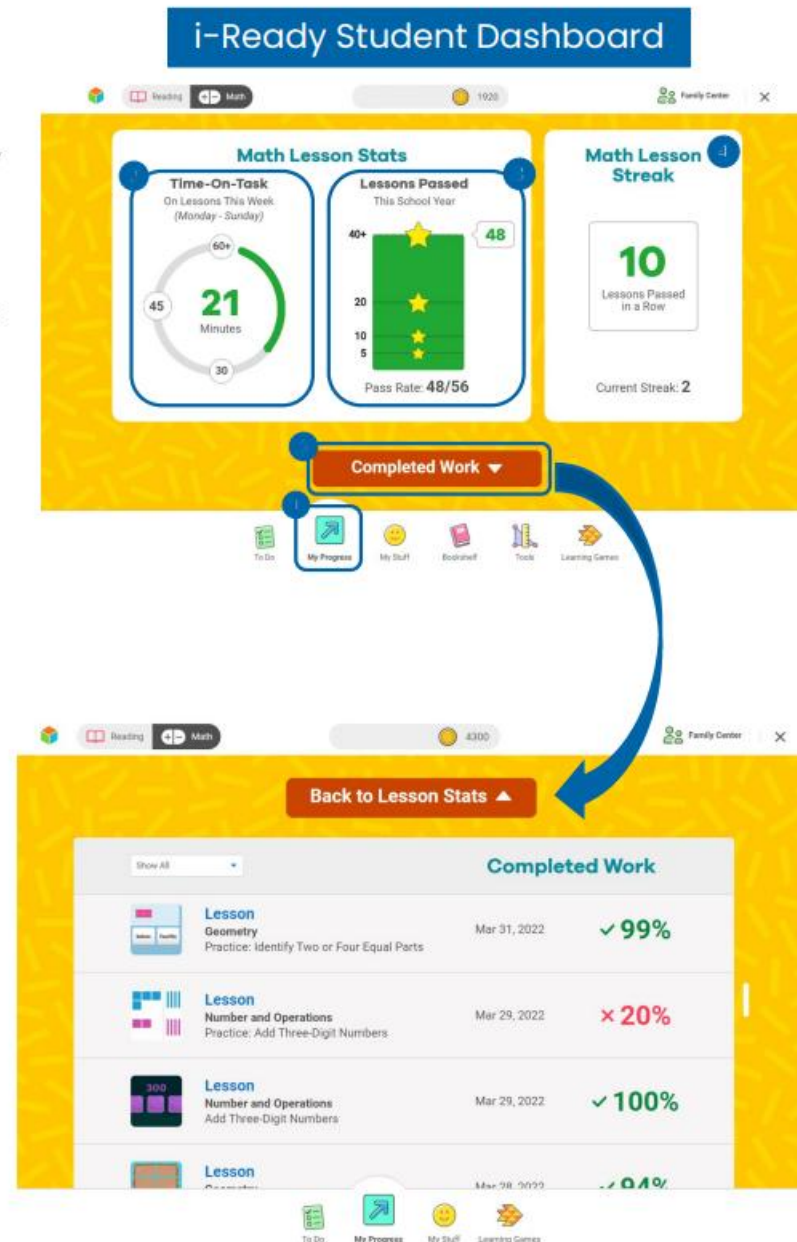
- How many lessons has your student passed?

1. To access the Clever portal directly, students can go to <https://www.clever.com> and select "Log in as Student."

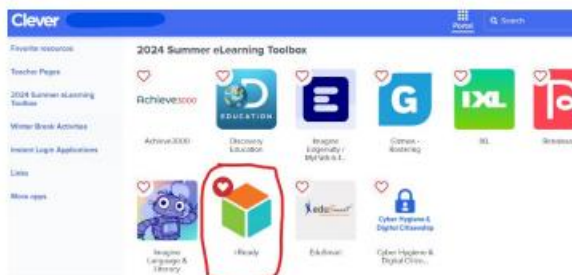

SUMMER READING 2025

You don't have to leave the house to travel to new places and meet new people. We are inviting our dragons to travel to some place new by reading a book this summer. The language arts department at Bowman Ashe Doolin Upper Academy has created the following Summer Reading Plan. You can also visit <http://read.dadeschools.net/> to access other free resources.

Entering 6 TH , 7 TH OR 8 TH	Students will read a book from the OER (Destiny Discover) app located in their student portal or a paperback copy of a grade level appropriate book. The book you choose MUST have at least 100 pages to read (or listen to). After reading the book, you will choose ONE of the following creative projects.
CREATIVE PROJECTS	
1	Create a MEME - Choose a character from the book you read and create an image (digitally or hand drawn). The picture can be of an actor/actress with similar features based on the author's description of the character. The text on the MEME must be relevant to the <u>plot</u> and include something the character has done or experienced in the book.
2	Create a RAP - It must be typed with a minimum of 20 lines. Your rap must include the author and title, as well as the setting, characters, plot, theme, and resolution from the story you read. You will need to perform the rap and record it electronically to be submitted to your teacher.
3	Make a video giving a "Pitch" (Pitch- presentation of an idea for a movie or tv show, in hopes of convincing a studio to turn your idea into a movie or TV show.) You will create a pitch explaining the reasons why (or why not) you feel this book would make a great movie! Record yourself giving the reasons to the director. You can dress up and include props. Your video should be 2 to 5 minutes in length. It will be graded on content and delivery.
4	Write a Blog like "Dear Abby" to include the character's conflict seeking advice from Dear Abby (use another name if you want) and make the response to the character as you give advice. This should be done as a SWAY using Microsoft Office. Be sure to explain the situation and Dear _____ advice in your SWAY. Be creative!
5	Create a Comic Strip on PowerPoint or on 8x11 paper with 8 to 10 scenes from the book showing the main events. Be sure to include dialogue bubbles and color illustrations for each scene. Please include the book's title and author.
6	Write a letter to the author from the character's point of view. Include reasons you like or dislike how he/she was portrayed. This should be at least one page, following letter format (Dear... Sincerely, _____). Please type in a word document and save it to email your teacher.
7	Create a TOP TEN list of the things you learned in the book. You may type or hand write your response neatly.

The completed activities are due to your child's new Language Arts teacher no later than **Friday, August 29, 2025**. They might need to be electronically submitted. Please plan accordingly.
